MANPOWER REPORT:

- A police supervisor was injured while off duty which required the surgical repair of a damaged shoulder. He has returned to work without restrictions.
- A patrol officer was injured after being struck by a vehicle which failed to stop at a stop sign, striking the officer who was directing traffic. The officer is undergoing therapy for his injuries and will be remain absent from duty until July.
- A patrol officer is out on extended leave with a non-work related medical condition.
- An officer is recovering at home after a non-work related medical procedure.

ARRESTS & INVESTIGATIONS:

- Acting on a tip from an out-of-state retired police, officer from our vice unit conducted an investigation allowing them to secure a search warrant for a private residence on Nicholson Road. An arrest warrant was subsequently obtained for Matthew Colabella charging him with the unlawful possession of 12 handguns and 33 rifles or shotguns and related offenses.

- The written test for patrol officer was administered at Freedom High School to 104 individuals. The physical agility portion of the testing process will be offered at Moravian College in mid-August.
